

A PROCLAMATION HONORING  
*Jeanette Fritzky*  
*For her Service to the Town of Moraga*

**WHEREAS**, Jeanette Fritzky, a native of Cincinnati, Ohio, relocated to the Bay Area in 2001 for a career opportunity. She and her husband, Bob, and children, Zac, Lindsay, Ann and Patrick, moved to the Town of Moraga for the phenomenal schools, engaged community and spectacular natural beauty; and

**WHEREAS**, Jeanette Fritzky's children attended Moraga schools and participated in a myriad of recreational and scholastic activities and Jeanette was an active volunteer in many youth-related activities, including Girl and Boy Scouts, roller hockey, soccer, cross country, lacrosse and cheerleading; and

**WHEREAS**, Jeanette Fritzky has also been an enthusiastic volunteer for the Town, active in the Moraga Parks Foundation, the Hacienda Foundation and Parks and Recreation celebrations and many other activities that spread joy; and

**WHEREAS**, Jeanette Fritzky in 2015 was appointed by the Town Council to the Park and Recreation Commission which developed the trails mapping project, supported the All-Access Playground, solidified the Commons Park Specific Plan, guiding the future use of this Town treasure, and served on the Art in Public Spaces Committee that developed and implemented a plan to bring sculptures to public spaces in Moraga; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2016, Jeanette Fritzky was elected to the Town Council of the Town of Moraga upon a platform of "Listen. Reason. Act." and has over the past two years served the community with dedication and devotion, possibly setting a record for the number of extra-curricular activities she attended, i.e. Mayors' Conferences, League of California Cities meetings and SWAT meetings. Jeanette brings an intellectual curiosity, strength of will, and a wealth of experience as a successful senior executive in the pharmaceutical industry to the Town Council and has moved numerous initiatives forward such as Hillside and Ridgeline regulations to protect Moraga's open space, implementation of security cameras to increase public safety, the completion of the Rheem Boulevard landslide repair project, the filling of the Rheem Boulevard sinkhole, opening of the Canyon Road temporary bridge and dedication of the new West Commons Park; and

**WHEREAS**, Jeanette Fritzky is recognized by her peers for her admirable insistence upon being true to her beliefs and unapologetic bravery to do what she thinks is right. She is recognized by the public for her thoughtful and faithful representation of Moragans during her tenure and her no-nonsense but kind demeanor, intelligence, honesty, integrity, sense of humor, and being a genuinely good person; and

**WHEREAS**, Jeanette Fritzky has brought her passion and commitment to raising awareness of social issues such as Denim Day, a campaign to prevent sexual violence through education and public awareness, and medical challenges, such as lupus, and now non-small cell lung cancer and its diagnosis among never-smokers. Specifically, an estimated 20% of lung cancer in U.S. women now occurs among never-smokers and in Asia, this proportion is as high as 80% with many diagnoses occurring in late stages of the disease.
